When DESiN's Co-Founder and CEO, Jon Dekar, was a teenager, his grandfather, a Navy veteran, was diagnosed with a degenerative neuromuscular disease. Over the next few years, he slowly lost the use of his arms. During this time, Jon witnessed his grandfather's frustration in being fed by others.

As the disease progressed, Jon observed how much his grandfather disliked being fed by a caregiver. What was once an enjoyable experience was now physically and emotionally stressful. He was no longer able to select the food he wanted or to control the pace at which he ate.

When Jon was in high school, he volunteered in nursing homes and hospitals and observed that his grandfather was not alone - many other individuals were experiencing the same undesirable feeding conditions.



1.1 HISTORY

In the fall of 2006 during Jon's first week in college, he observed a six-year-old girl who had to eat every meal by placing her face in a plate of food. At first, he decided to craft a mechanism with available materials to solely help this girl (prototype Alpha), but his attention quickly shifted towards developing a modern, state of the art machine for everyone.

After over ten years of persistence and overcoming many daunting challenges, Obi is now an award-winning product currently available in many countries around the world.

Obi is a first of its kind, revolutionary dining device for individuals who lack upper extremity function. Obi increases independence, social interaction, and effective food capturing like never before. With the momentary touch of a switch, Obi allows users to select between four compartments of food and to command when the food is captured and delivered to their mouth.

"Obi" comes from the word "Obeisance," which Webster Dictionary defines as a gesture of respect or reverence.


2.0 MEET OBI





2.1 PRODUCT FEATURES

Obi gives the diner control over food selection and delivery by automating the motion of a human arm during eating. Through use of the robotic arm, the device becomes an extension of the user, conducting their intent of what and when to eat.

Obi is operated through Accessibility Switches that can be actuated by any part of the body. Obi even works with Sip-and-Puff attachments!




CUSTOMIZED DELIVERY



2.2 INTENDED USERS

Obi accommodates a spectrum of people who are living with a condition affecting their upper extremity function. Diners should possess the ability to safely and successfully operate Obi, as well as the ability to chew and swallow without assistance. Candidates for Obi may be living with the following conditions:

Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS)
Amputation
Arthrogryposis Multiple Congenita (AMC)
Cerebral Palsy
Essential Tremor
Muscular Dystrophy
Multiple Sclerosis
Parkinson's Disease
Spinal Cord Injury
Other conditions impairing upper extremity
motor control

2.3 INTENDED USE

Obi increases a diner's independence and confidence by providing choice among four food compartments and allowing the user to control when food is delivered to their mouth.

FREQUENCY OF USE

Obi is for intermittent use and should be operated for the duration of a single meal. Between each meal, at least a one-hour power off break is good practice and will help maximize the useful life of Obi.

TEMPERATURE

Obi is designed to be used at room temperature. Extreme hot or cold temperatures may prevent Obi from turning on or operating correctly.

ENVIRONMENTS

Obi is equipped with a rechargeable lithium ion battery and weighs only 7 pounds, making it possible to dine in a variety of environments, such as:

3.3 USAGE, WARRANTY, AND SERVICE INFORMATION (U.S.)

FREQUENCY OF USE

Obi is for intermittent use and should be operated for the duration of a single meal. Between each meal, at least a one hour power off break is good practice. Significant power off breaks help maximize the life of Obi.

LIMITED WARRANTY TERM

12 months from the date or shipment or after the first 400 hours of usage, whichever occurs first.

LIMITATIONS

Only manufacturing defects of materials or workmanship are covered when Obi is used properly and maintained in accordance with all instructions. This Warranty is void if Obi is improperly handled, dropped, put in the microwave, or exposed to excessive liquids. In addition, any attempt(s) to open or dismantle Obi, including the Arm or Base assembly, will void this Warranty.

The Limited Warranty excludes Spoons, Plates, Placemats, and switches. Spoons, Plates, Placemats, and switches are non-returnable once used.
